Support is now needed to do your/our share in seeking recognition for Clinton native Captain E. Royce Williams, Retired, who served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, Korean and Vietnam wars. He served in Korea from 1952-53 - 70 missions; and Vietnam 1965-67 - 110 missions, serving our country for over 30 years, retiring in 1980.

Captain Williams singlehandedly shot down four MIG's during the Korean War protecting the Navy Fleet. His story was kept "Top Secret" for over 50 years.

In a recent issue of The Northern Star, his story was told - and as of September 1, there is a request for 100,000 online signatures to help him receive the Medal of Honor for his Act of Valor. The collection of signatures has

a deadline - must be completed in the 30 days of September 2016.

Williams, now 91 years of age, resides in Escondido, CA, where he and his late wife, Camilla (Forde), also a Clinton native, retired following his active duty. He was a member of the Clinton High School graduating class of 1943.

His story was featured in an issue of Homeland Magazine earlier this year, and that publication has the information regarding the petition on its website.
